






CULTURAL EVENTS IN 2025

Celebrating Venezuela | July 26 | 11am-3pm Libery Park Spokane



Venezuelan culture is a fusion of Indigenous, African, and Spanish influences, evident in its music, dance, food, and festivals. Traditional music genres like joropo, with its lively rhythms and use of instruments like the harp, maracas, and cuatro, are central to many festivities. Come enjoy delicious arepas (cornmeal cakes), hallacas (a type of tamale), and pabellón criollo (the national dish consisting of rice, black beans, and shredded beef).



By celebrating Día de los Muertos in Spokane, we not only preserve and share Mexican culture but also provide a space for healing, remembrance, and community connection. Join us as we celebrate life and honor our loved ones in a beautiful and meaningful way.

Each day of our week-long celebration holds special significance:

- Monday, October 27: We welcome back our beloved pets from beyond with a special pet-only altar.
- Tuesday, October 28: We honor those who died suddenly, placing candles and white flowers on the altar.
- Wednesday, October 29: We pay tribute to those who died by drowning.
- Thursday, October 30: We dedicate this day to the forgotten souls who no longer have family.
- Friday, October 31: Children who were born or died without being baptized are remembered.
- Saturday, November 1: We honor all the children who passed away with a skull painting workshop and a procession.

6. Tamalada: Tamale Festival | November 22 |



Our annual Tamalada event is a celebration of tamale culture! This exciting event features vendors selling delicious tamales from various Latin countries, offering a unique culinary experience for all attendees.

At the heart of our Tamalada is the friendly competition to crown the best tamale. Participants can taste tamales from different traditions and regions, and then cast their votes for their favorite. The tamale with the most votes wins the prestigious title of "Best Tamale" and a \$200 cash prize!

7. Christmas Posada & Toy Drive | December 13

In this tradition, two people portray Mary and Joseph, leading a candlelit procession through the community, symbolizing their search for shelter. This procession, filled with neighbors and friends adorned in costumes, stops at various homes each night. Initially turned away, they eventually find a welcoming home where the community gathers to celebrate.

In our community, 'La Posada' is more than just an inn; it's about opening our hearts and homes. The phrase 'dar posada' means offering a place to stay for free, symbolizing a warm, welcoming space for all.

Latinos En Spokane hosts this annual Posada to celebrate and preserve Latin American traditions. Together, we share traditional holiday foods, desserts, songs, piñatas, and distribute toys to Latino and immigrant families. Leading up to the Posada, we collect toys for our annual Toy Drive, which culminates during the event. Last year, thanks to the generosity of our community, we were able to distribute over 500 toys to children.
